Bangor Man Has Part in Unique Medical Performance in Maine General Hospital.

(Bangor Commercial.) Saving of a woman's life after she had stopped breathing for thirty minutes and her heart had stopped beating, was performed a short time ago by three doctors at the Maine General

Hospital in Portland, of which one was Edward Whalen, son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Whalen of 32 Fern street, who became an interne in that institution after completing a medical school course course last Júne.

The patient had been overcome by fumes from a gas range, which she thought to be properly lighted, while the hospital authorities stated that she had also taken an overdose of a drug used to induce sleep. The doctors worked over the woman for more than two hours, alternating periods of artificial respiration with hypodermic injections of stimulants, that are an aid in restoring life, and their efforts were rewarded by her reviving to a point where they were able to discontinue the treatment.

Some idea of the near death which the patient had reached may be gained from the fact that two tanks of oxygen were pumped into her lungs, alternately with the use of a stomach pump to remove the drug which she had swallowed. The case was characterized as one of the most unique in the annals of emergency cases in Portland by hospital authorities and by the police, who removed the woman from her home to the hospital in an ambúlance and applied all possible means of artificial respiration while on the way.


