Consentance Money—Bank of Traffic—Spanish Consulate Changes—Not Allowed to Work. (SPECIAL TO THE GAZETTE.) QUEBEC, Nov. 4.—The public works department received the sum of \$50 through E. Warwick, of Montreal, as consentance money. The sum of \$25 was received by the department for public works from the same party four years ago.
