ALBERTA HAS PLAN TO LIGHTEN TAXATION OF THE FARMER BY RAISING ASSESSMENT OF UNIMPROVED LAND.

Edmonton, Sept. 19.—To further relieve agriculture from the burden of taxation, and to place the burden upon speculative holders of farm lands, important amendments to the rural municipalities act will be brought at the next session of the Alberta legislature. By an act passed at the session of the legislature last spring, assessment of lands was made the sole basis of municipal revenue, while a rebate of 25 per cent. of all taxes was provided for the benefit of farmers who improve their holdings. It is now proposed that this rebate shall be raised to fifty per cent., so that the man who owns a quarter section wholly under cultivation will pay in taxes exactly one-half as much as the man who is owner of an adjoining unimproved farm.
