In his charge to the grand jury His Honor said he was sorry to find so many criminal cases before him, eight being the largest number he had ever had in this county, yet it was only a wave, as the county had for years been fairly free from crime.

His Honor reviewed the docket.




Kakabeka Falls of the Kammistiquia



Kakabeka Falis, twenty-two miles west of Port Arthur on the Canadian Northern Railway, are among the most beautiful in Canada.
