

Paris, Sept. 8-The French troops have captured the village of Mennessis, about four miles north of Tergnier and on the St. Quentin canal. Further south they have penetrated to the northern fringe of the St. Gobain forest up to the outskirts of the village of Soivais, according to the French communication issued today.

"South of the Oise the French have made progress to the outskirts of Soivais.


