Brattleboro, Vt., Nov. 7—Elmore's Island, between Hinsdale and Vernon on the Connecticut River, has been obliterated by the freshet following the heavy rains of the last two days. The island was one of the landmarks of the river in this vicinity. It was several acres in extent and was heavily wooded. Since the freshet conditions began, the water held back by the cofferdam, recently constructed by the Connecticut River Power Company, submerged the island and carried it away, great trees being torn from their positions and borne away by the current. A flock of sheep, the only living things on the island, were taken away before the water had completely covered it. The freshet is the highest autumn rise of the water since 1869. The submerged island was owned by Elijah Stockwell, of Vernon.
