that the same shall remain and be in Force, and have Effect, as if this Act had never been made.

Former Provisions made for the Province to be null and void after May 1, 2775.

And whereas the Provisions, made by the said Proclamation, in respect to the Civil Government of the said Province of Quebec. and the Powers and Authorities given to the Governor and other Civil Officers of the faid Province, by the Grants and Commissions issued in consequence thereof, have been found, upon Experience, to be inapplicable to the State and Circumstances of the said Province, the Inhabitants whereof amounted, at the Conquest, to above Sixtyfive thousand Persons professing the Religion of the Church of Rome. and enjoying an established Form of Constitution and System of Laws, by which their Persons and Property had been protected. governed, and ordered, for a long Series of Years, from the First Establishment of the said Province of Canada; be it therefore further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That the said Proclamation, so far as the same relates to the said Province of Quebec, and the Commission under the Authority whereof the Government of the said Province is at present administered, and all and every the Ordinance and Ordinances made by the Governor and Council of Quebec for the Time being, relative to the Civil Government and Administration of Justice in the faid Province, and all Commissions to Judges and other Officers thereof, be, and the same are hereby revoked, annulled, and made void, from and after the First Day of May, One thousand feven hundred and seventy-five.

Inhabitants of Quebec may profess the Romifb Religicy, as by Acta Rliz.

And, for the more perfect Security and Ease of the Minds of the Inhabitants of the faid Province, it is hereby declared, That on, subject to the His Majesty's Subjects, professing the Religion of the Church of King's Suprema- Rome of and in the said Province of Quebec, may have, hold, and enjoy, the free Exercise of the Religion of the Church of Rome, subject to the King's Supremacy, declared and established by an Act, made in the First Year of the Reign of Queen Elizabeth, over all the Dominions and Countries which then did, or thereafter should and the Clergy en- belong, to the Imperial Crown of this Realm; and that the Clergy of the said Church may hold, receive, and enjoy, their accustomed Dues and Rights, with respect to such Persons only as shall profess the said Religion.
