

for the Dist. of Montreal, 30 June, 1848; Inspector and Superintendent of Police for City of Montreal, 2nd Feb., 1856; Judge of the Sessions of the Peace for Montreal 1870; a Commr. under 31 Vic. ch. 94, 23 Nov. 1869; and Commr. of Police for the Dominion, same date. Was a Commr. apptd. to inquire into the state of the Montreal Registry Office, 23 April, 1850; and has held the Office of Mayor of Montreal. Created a Knight of the Order of Charles III. of Spain, 1872. Resigned Judgeship, Sept. 1878, in order to contest Montreal East for the Commons, in which he was successful. CURRAN, JOHN JOSEPH, Q.C., B.C.L., LL.D. (*Montreal Centre*.)

S. of the late Charles Curran, a native of Co. Down, and Sarah Kennedy, Co. Wexford, Irel., who came to Canada early in the present century. B. in Montreal, 22 Feb. 1842. Ed. at St. Mary's Coll. Montreal, and at Ottawa Univ. Graduated B.C.L. at McGill Coll. 1862. M., in 1865, Mary Elizabeth, youngest dau. of the late Mr. Patrick Brennan, Montreal. Called to the Bar, P. Q., March, 1863, and apptd. a Q.C., 20 Jan., 1882. The Manhattan Coll., N.Y., under the presidency of Cardinal McCloskey, conferred the degree of LL.D. on him, June 1881. Has been a frequent contributor to the magazines, periodicals and newspaper press. Is Presdt. of the Alumni Asso. of the Ottawa Univ. Unsuccessfully contested Shelford for the Commons at g.e. 1874. First returned to Parl. at g.e. 1882, and re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative.—*Montreal*.

DALY, THOMAS MAYNE. (*Se/kirk*.)

S. of the late T. M. Daly, Stratford, Ont., who represented Co. of Perth in the Leg. Assem. of Can., from 1854 to 1863, and North Perth in the House of Commons and Ontario Assem. at different times from the Union to 1875. B. at Stratford, Ont., 16 Aug., 1852.
