

**An Act to amend the Act to regulate the Inspection of
Beef and Pork.**

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Act of 1841, intituled, *An Act to regulate the inspection of Beef and Pork*, and more exactly to define what quality of pork it shall be lawful for Inspectors to class and brand as Mess Pork; Therefore Her Majesty, &c., enacts as follows:

Preamble.
Act 4, 5 V.

I. Notwithstanding anything in the twenty-second section or any other part of the said Act contained, it shall be lawful for the Inspector, when the hogs under his inspection shall exceed two hundred pounds each in weight, to make "Mess Pork" of such rib and side pieces thereof, cut in the manner and of the weight prescribed by the said section, as shall in his judgment be equal in quality to Mess Pork, as defined by the said section hereby amended.
