

The Honorable Sir *Alexander Campbell* moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Aikins*,

That the Honorable the Speaker, the Honorable Mr. *Scott* and the mover be requested, during the vacation, to ascertain upon what terms arrangements can be made with Daily papers in *Ottawa*, *Toronto* and *Montreal*, to have the debates of the Senate attended during the next Session of Parliament by a Reporter or Reporters commissioned by them, to give a daily *resumé* of the debates to be published in such Daily papers on each morning next after such debates, with power to make provisional arrangements to that end.
