Oath being made by the Mafter of the Vellel, that the Fith brought in, came from the Gulph of S. Larerence,

Penalty on ren.eving Fith before tendered to the Oftuer.

Ling, or bake, caught and cured in Chaleur Bay, or any other Part of the Gulph of Saint Lawrence, or on the Ceast of Labrador; may it therefore please Bour Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Wajesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Logds Spiritual and Tempozal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the valling of this At, it hall and may be lawful to import, bring in, in British-built Clessels, navigated according to Law, and subject to the Rules prescribed in an Act of the Tenth and Eleventh Pears of the Reign of Dis late Wajesty King William the Third, (intituled, An Act to encourage the Trade to Newfoundland), and to land in Great Britain, all Cod fish, Ling, and bake, caught and cured in Chaleur Bay, or any other Part of the Gulph of Saint Lawrence, or on the Coast of Labrador, so as Dath be first made before the Landing thereof, by the Owner or Proprietor of such Kill, or the Waster of the Clessel bzinging the same, befoze the Officer foz the Duties on Salt, in the Port or Place where fuch fish thall be imported or brought in, (who is hereby required to administer the same without Fee or Charge), that all the fifth so imported or brought in came from the Gulph of Saint Lawrence, or the Coast of Labrador, and were caught and cured there; and so as the said fish be, at the Landing thereof, and before the same be removed from the Shoze, tendered to the Officer of the Post or Place for the said Duties, to have Part of the Cail of every such Cod fish, Ling, or bake, cut off, that no Allowance for such fish may be obtained upon Exportation; and the faid Officer is bereby impowered and required to cut off Part of the Tail of all such fish on the Landing thereof: And in case any such fish shall from the shore he landed of removed from the Shore before the same thall be tendered to the Officer, to have Part of the Tail cut, as afozesaid, all the fish so imported and landed thall be fozfeited, and Double the Calue thereof, to be recovered of the Imparter, Proprietor, or Master of the Uestel.
