The main function of co-ordinator of student activities is to provide the close liaison that must exist between Students' Council and all clubs and organizations within the Students' Union. The key to the success of this function is embodied in two works—co-ordination and communication. Any man contesting this position must be able to efficiently perform these duties.

There are three simple and fundamental planks in this candidate's platform but before they are listed one more point is in order. Any guarantee by anyone contesting a position in student government must be absolute and there is therefore only one promise that I can make in all honesty—that the carrying out of my policy will be the subject of all my energies and that it will be done conscientiously and diligently. These are the ultimate ends and what follows constitutes the means.

1. In the interests of communication, there should be developed a system of monthly bulletins to all students which will outline all campus events for the coming month. This has been promised for years; it is now time for the co-ordinator to take positive steps toward its implementation.

2. In the interests of co-ordination, this candidate will, if elected, schedule social events in conjunction with weekend athletic events with the aim of increasing student interest and campus participation in both areas.

3. Finally, the plan developed this year which involves the setting up of a program board to co-ordinate the activities of all campus organizations under its direction holds much promise. However, without the proper guidance, this board could become an ineffectual body. It follows, then, that the co-ordinator must chair all meetings of this committee and must have organized an exhaustive schedule to prevent conflicts of all kinds.

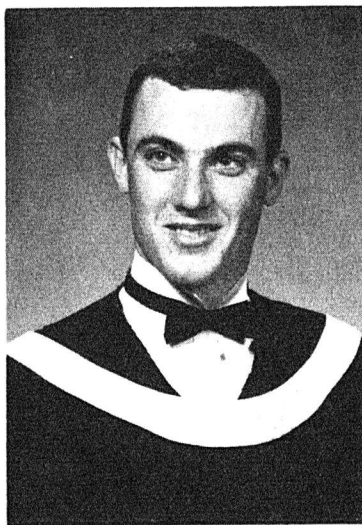

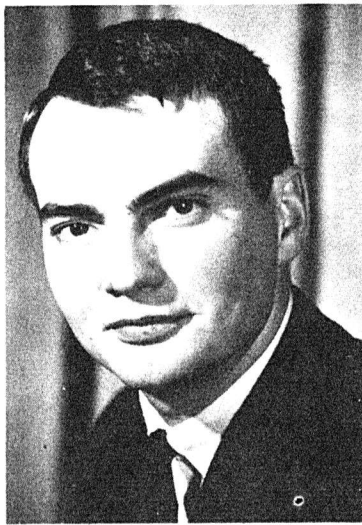
• A Program Board under the chairmanship of the co-ordinator and consisting of representatives from all campus organizations would co-ordinate all campus activities, and provide the vital link between Students' Council and the students. The Program Board would allow more co-operation and understanding between the organizers of competing campus activities.

• Promotions Committee must continue to promote knowledge of and interest in all campus activities. However, if we are to maintain the level of unified campus spirit which has been shown on numerous occasions this year, and yet devote more support to non-athletic activities, the scope of Promotions must be enlarged. This enlargement will lead to a gradual alignment into athletic and non-athletic branches.

• Several bulletin boards must be placed in conspicuous locations on campus. Space on these boards would have to be reserved, giving all
