Camp Borden, Ont.	4-6-40		<p>At approximately 1745 hours, smoke was noticed coming through the floor at the foot of the stairs in Barrack Block A-50. The fire alarm was given and all camp personnel on the Station turned to. The fire was confined to beneath the floor 'til 1830 hours and everything movable was taken out of the building. At 1830 hours, flames burst through and at 1850 hours the roof fell in. A garage, A-52, at rear of A-50 was also destroyed. No casualties. The Station personnel worked unceasingly and localized the fire to these two buildings. At one time, it appeared as if Q-10 would be lost too, but, though the peak of the roof took fire several times, a change of wind saved it, as well as Air Force personnel on the roof and galleries with a hose.</p> <p>The Army co-operated with great willingness, supplying a truck load of extinguishers and personnel who worked with great zeal.</p> <p>The All-Clear went at approximately 2000 hours.</p> <p>Group Captain Ssitta, R.N.Z.A.F., visited Station. Departed by air 1730 hours. Brigadier Foster and Sqn.Ldr. Rodgers visited Station in connection with Auxiliary Services.</p> <p>Press - Tom Walsh and Miss Gibb, Toronto Daily Star - visited the Station with authority of No. 1 Training Command.</p>
