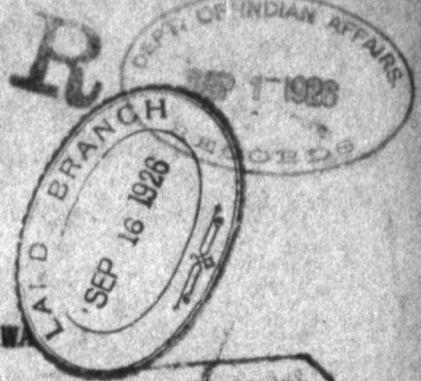

Thursday the 26th August, 1926.

PRESENT:

HIS EXCELLENCY

THE GOVERNOR GENERAL IN COUNCIL:

WHEREAS the Department of Public Works of the Province of British Columbia has applied to the Department of Indian Affairs for two parcels of land in the Dragon Lake Indian reserve No 3, containing together 2.37 acres, for road purposes, the lands may be described as follows:

"All those portions of the Dragon Lake Indian reserve No 3 shown coloured in pink on plans numbered Rd. 2068 and Rd. 2127, of record in the Surveys Branch of the Department of Indian Affairs."

AND WHEREAS the lands, which have been valued at \$40.00 have been paid for in full by the Provincial Government;

THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor General in Council, on the recommendation of the Acting Superintendent General of Indian Affairs and pursuant to the provisions of Section 46 of the Indian Act, as amended by Section 1 of Chap. 14, 1-2 George V, is pleased to order that the said lands be and they are hereby transferred to the Province of British Columbia.
