**Map Study.**—Geographically the Ottoman Turkish countries were all portions of the Byzantine Empire, and Turkish history relates either to Turkish assimilation or to Turkish debasement of Byzantine civilization, therefore the sequence of maps for the Byzantine Empire should be examined. Its connection and identity with the Roman Empire should be also observed. See pp. 116, 140, 154, 156, 182, 200, 228. See maps of European Turkey at pp. 296, 298, and 300. At p. 293 are best indicated the dimensions of Bosnia, Servia, Wallachia, and Moldavia. At p. 300 see Montenegro. Localities are mentioned in the order of reference.
