

fulfil the predictions of the Prophets. I do not see how we can reject the former arguments. Will you refer to some of these scriptures?

A. Yes, and having done so I must leave you to think this subject out for yourself. 1st. Israel in her glory was to be a kingdom on which the sun and moon never sets. Isa. 60:20, 21, 22, Thy sun shall no more go down; neither shall thy moon withdraw itself: for the Lord shall be thine everlasting light, and the days of thy mourning shall be ended. It is the boast of Englishmen that the sun never goes down on Her Majesty's dominions. 2nd. Israel's location must be the *Islands*, and those must be *North West* from Palestine, and Israel was also to be a nation before the Lord forever: Jere. 31:35-37, "Thus saith the Lord, which giveth the sun for a light by day, and the ordinances of the moon and of the stars for a light by night, which divideth the sea when the waves thereof roar; The Lord of hosts is his name: If those ordinances depart from before me, saith the Lord, then the seed of Israel also shall cease from being a nation before me for ever. Thus saith the Lord; If heaven above can be measured, and the foundations of the earth searched out beneath, I will also cast off all the seed of Israel for all that they have done saith the Lord. The very opposite, observe, was to be the condition of Judah. Jere. 15:4-5, "And I will cause them to be removed into all kingdoms of the earth, because of Manasseh the son of Hezekiah king of Judah, for that which he did in Jerusalem. For who shall have pity upon thee, O Jerusalem? or who shall bemoan thee? or who shall go aside to ask how thou doest?" Isa. 42:4, "The Isles shall wait for his law." Jere. 31:10, "Hear the word of the Lord, O ye nations, and declare it in the *Isles afar off*; he that scattered Israel will gather him. Isa. 59:18, "According to their deeds, accordingly he will repay, fury to his adversaries, recompense to his enemies; to the islands he will repay recompense. So shall they fear the name of the Lord from the west, and his glory from the rising of the sun. When the enemy shall come in like a flood, the Spirit of the Lord shall lift up a standard against him." Jere. 3:18, "They shall come together out of the land of the North." The identity is clear. They were to be a nation inhabiting islands to the north and west of Palestine. As there are no islands so situated but the British Isles, it is clear those were indicated by the prophets. 3rd. The name by which the Islands were anciently known is mentioned in scripture in such a way as to call attention to well known events of English history. It is called the land of the *covenant* and the people are called the covenant people. Isa. 43:6, "I the Lord have called thee in righteousness and will hold thine hand, and will keep thee and give thee to *Britham* for a light of the Gentiles." And again. Isa. 49:8, "I will preserve thee and give thee to
