D. B. Viger to Neilson. (In French.) Speaking of the Land Company, he observed that they were seeking a charter, and had gone to Lord Goderich to protest against the granting of such an instrument as the effect of the company's operations will be to increase the price of land to the settler. He fears it is a scheme of Mr. Ellice's, who wishes to dispose of his lands to the company. He believes the charter will be granted. Draws attention to articles in English papers on Canadian affairs.
