- 'No. 2. is a general account of merchandize imported into the province from the 15th of February 1793, to the 4th of · February, 1794. inclusive, the duties whereon amount to the fum of £ 1502 8 9 ½ by which account it appears that the duties collected in the county of Charlotte from the 2d. day of · February, 1793. to the 24th of January, 1794. inclusive, a-• mounts to the fum of  $104 18 0 \frac{3}{4}$  from which fum the · Collector Joseph Garnett, Esquire, has retained in his hands • his commissions for collecting being  $f_{0}$  10 9 9  $\frac{1}{2}$ . and it further appears by this account that he has also retained in his ' hands out of the faid sum collected, the further sum of firs 12 4. for gauging and weighing, as stated in the said account—for particulars of this transaction the committee refer ' to Joseph Garnetts account rendered to the Treasurer, No. 3.—
- No. 3. is a general account current whereby it appears that there was in the Treasury on the 4th day of this instant February, 1794. belonging to the Province the sum of £1590 10 3. 'also fundry Bonds amounting to the sum of £369 14 1 3.— By this account it appears that the Treasurer has paid sundry warrants of His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor amounting to £279 11 11 as appears by account No. 4.—It also ap- pears by this account that the Treasurer has paid to the Attoroney General the fum of £2 6 8 as a fee for his opinion in a case as stated in paper Ne. 7.
- No. 5. contains an account of the monies arising from the ' tonnage of veffels pailing the Light House into the Harbour of · Saint John, from the 15th day of February, 1793. to the 4th of February, 1794. inclusive, amounting to the sum of [113 · 19 0.
- . No. 6. John Colvill and Company account for fundries furenished the Light House, and expences incurred in providing for the same amounting to the sum of £154 0 5. including a ballance of £31 1 11. as charged in a former account rendered February 6th 1793.—It appears by this account that he has received from the Treasurer by a warrant from the Lieutenant Governor £151 1 11. and that he has also given e credit for the sum of Twenty Shillings for a barrel of Drugs of Oil, which leaves a ballance due to the Commissioners of the Light House of £1 18 6. which ballance appears to be received by the Treaturer and credited in his account current No. 3.
