"Reign, entitled, an Act for the better regulation of Elections, and to re-"gulate Elections for Members to ferve in General Affembly in future." Mr. Stewart, Jun. in the Chair; after fome time fpent therein the Speaker refumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported that the Committee had gone through and made feveral alterations and amendments therein.

On Motion of Mr. Holland, leave was given to bring in a Bill, entitled "An Act concerning Land Surveyors, and the admeasurement of Land."

A Meffage from His Majesty's Council by their Clerk, with the joint Petition of both Houses praying His Majesty, for certain aid out of the Quit Rent Fund, together with the Estimate referred to therein, agreed to.

Moved by Mr. Palmer, That a joint Address of both Houses be pre: fented to his Excellency the Lieut. Governor, requesting he would be pleased to transmit the same, which being prepared and agreed to, was sent up to his Majesty's Council for their concurrence, and returned by their Clerk agreed to, and is as follows:

"To His Excellency JOSEPH FREDERICK WALLET DESBARRES, Lieutenant Governor - and Commander in Cheif, in and over His Majesty's Island Prince Edward, and the Territories thereunto adjacent, Chancellor and Vice Admir al of the same, Sc. Sc. Sc.

"The ADDRESS of His Majestys Council and House of Assembly, in GENERAL ASSEMBLY, Convened.

"MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

" W E His Majefty's Colonial Council and Houfe of Affembly, in General Affembly convened, beg leave to repretent to your Excellency that we have taken into our confideration that part of your Excellency's Speech which recommends the exertion of the legiflature towards the improvement of the Ifland, in confequence of which we have determined to reprefent our fituation to his most Gracious Majefty by the Petition which we herewith request leave to lay before your Excellency, praying the Royal Bounty therein mentioned. We therefore humbly entreat that your Excellency may be pleafed to caufe the flid Petition to be prefented to His Majefty, together with your Excellency's recommendation in support of the fame; and alfo, that your Excellency will be pleafed to forward to His Majefty's Ministers such representations as may conduce towards obtaining their favorable report upon the fubject of the faid Petition.
