that behalf; or in default of such agreement by any Arbitrator to be appointed in that behalf by the Supreme Court of Civil Justice of British Columbia, upon the summary application of either party; the decision of every such Arbitrator to be final.

Bridge to revert to Her Majesty on forfeiture, &c. IV. Provided that on forfeiture or other determination of the privileges by such Ordinance conferred on the said Thomas Spence, his executors, administrators, and assigns, the said Bridge and all improvements thereto shall revert to the use of Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors absolutely, and the moneys arising from the said Bridge and Tolls, less the cost of collection, shall be deemed and accounted for as part of the Public Revenue; and the powers, remedies, and privileges herein contained shall thereupon be exercised by and on behalf of Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors.

Short Title.

V. This Ordinance may be cited for all purposes as "The Thompson Bridge Ordinance, 1868."
