**Montreal Cattle Market.**  
MONTREAL, July 3.—The receipts of live stock were small, comprising only about four car-loads, and the offerings were principally grass-fed cattle. The demand for choice shipping grades, however, continues brisk, at from 50 to 55c per pound live weight, but the supply of first-class cattle is apparently lessening every week. Jas. McShane, Sr., made the following purchases of cattle:—From Wm. Roberts, Granby, 28 head for \$1,410; from James Eakins, Port Hope, 3 loads, as follows:—36 head at \$1,970; 20 at \$720, and 7 at \$210; and from Sam Burnett, Toronto, 21 head at \$1,512. Mr. Eakins' cattle would average 1,300 lbs. each for one load, and 2,100 and under for the remainder, and the price which he realized would range from 35c to 50c per lb. R. J. Hopper also sold 10 head to local butchers at from \$30 to \$40 each, and Wm. Cook sold 20 head to Sam Price at 50c per lb.

**New Brunswick Synod.**—A despatch from Fredericton says: At this afternoon's session of the Church Synod, E. B. Chandler made a point that the offering was illegal, proper notice of meeting not having been given. A committee was appointed to investigate and the reported that Mr. Chandler's opinion was correct. The synod adjourned, previous to which the Bishop announced that he would call a special meeting late in September or early in October. The question of appointing a coadjutor Bishop on the nomination of the Lord Bishop will then come up.

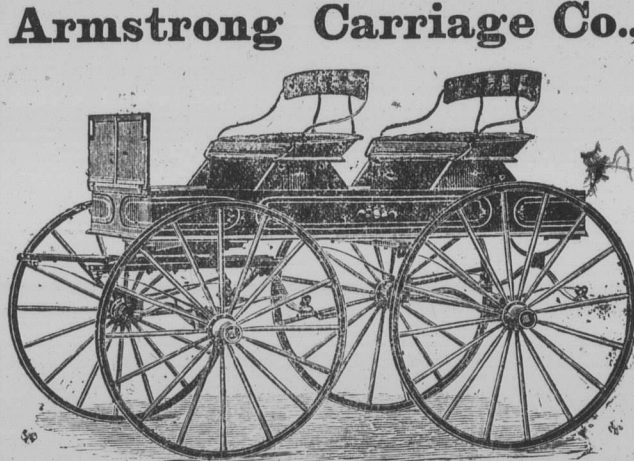
