

## NO RETURN TO THE OPEN BAR

Defeat of Present Prohibition Act Means New System of Government Control and Death to the Boot-legger

"Whatever may be the result with respect to either of the questions submitted, there shall be no return to the old system of the open bar."-Premier Foster.

Twentyfive per cent. of the drunks to my mind are taking liquor and the other seventy-five per cent. lemon extract, etc. The way this act is being carried out in St. John today is a criminal outrage.


