CONSERVATIVE PLATFORM.

"The Provincial executive will be reduced from nine to seven."

"No public money will be expended in excess of legislative appropriations, unless in case of unavoidable necessity, such as caused by flood or sudden disaster."

"Provision will be made for a quarterly publication of revenue and expenditure."

"The office of Commissioner of Public Lands will be abolished and the duties assigned to the Attorney General."

"The present ferry system will be reformed with a view to greater economy of expenditure without diminishing efficiency of accommodation."

"A return in the administration of the Surrogate and Probate court will be effected."

"A radical change will be made in the administration of the Public Works department, so that the money now wasted can be saved to the Province."

"The present system of taxation will be so changed that it will operate with even-handed justice and not bear oppressively and unfairly on any class of taxpayers."

"Economy will be practised in every department and taxation will be kept down to the lowest possible limit."

"The efficiency of the Public Service will be maintained, and revenue and expenditure will be made to square as nearly as possible."

"No further increase of the public debt will be permitted."

"There will be considerable reduction in the expenditure of the pullic money, and the resources of the Province will be safe-guarded and husbanded by every legitimate means that can be secured."

Liberal Record.

"They promised to greatly reduce the Scott Act expenditure. They have largely increased it."

"In the strongest language they condemned a provincial debt. In five years they have added over a quarter of a million of dollars to our debt."

"They solemnly professed that they could manage our affairs without taxation. In three years they have taken from the people over one hundred and thirty-eight thousand dollars in taxes."

"They protested against the practice of borrowing money at the banks. There has scarcely been a year since they attained power, that the Province has not owed very large amounts to one or more of the banks."

"They pledged themselves not to impose taxation without consulting the people. No sooner was the promise made than it was faithfully broken by the introduction and passage into law of four separate tax acts."

"They seriously engaged in 1897, to devote about 15,000 dollars of the money to be raised by debentures to the repair of the Provincial building. This has not been done. The building has received no repairs."

"They loudly proclaimed, in opposition, that there was no necessity for a Commissioner of Public Lands. That official still exists, although they have been in power for over six years."

"They denounced, with one voice, Provincial deficits. There has not been a single year of their administration that there has not been a large deficit - their deficits aggregate over \$25,000, and if the taxes they collected be added, the astounding result of over \$393,000 will be reached."

Significant.

It is significant of the extreme weakness of the One-Man-Government that five or six of its most prominent supporters in the last election are now candidates on the part of the Opposition. These independent Liberals represent the discontent of the Liberal party with the autocratic methods of Premier Peters, the deception which has been practiced, and the load of debt and taxation which has been placed upon the shoulders of the people. Such men are not to be humbugged by the mere suggestion that a great amount of money - stated by some of Mr. Peters' agents at \$5,000,000 - will be obtained from the Dominion Government on the bald application for a costly court of arbitration over our claims. The suggestion rests upon nothing tangible. It has never been stated by any member of the Dominion Government that arbitration is necessary or will be permitted. There is nothing definite about the proposition. It is a mere election kite at which the people may stare, but by which they are not to be induced to renew the confidence which Mr. Peters has forfeited. - Ex.

Mr. Bell.

Mr. Peters is followed by a heterogeneous band, including Richards and Jamieson, McNutt and Cumiskey, Farquharson and Haley. But there is no more striking figure, no more wonderful specimen of shuffling inconsistency, it than Mr. J. H. Bell. Mr. Bell is now the Peters' candidate in the Fourth District of Prince County. Yet he went about the Province a few months ago denouncing Mr. Peters' policy and administration. Mr. Bell's judgment condemns almost every act of one-man government. But every act of that Government has been supported by his vote. Mr. Bell is a queer fish, a sort of inconsistency incarnate. An elector having regard for intelligence and propriety will not, now that he has found out, elect him as its representative. - Ex.
