Praise for Dr. Grenfell

Editor Evening Telegram: Dear Sir—In your issue of the 1st of May there was an article from the pen of one who signs himself Newfoundland. Well, sir, I am glad my country has not produced many of his sort. He starts off with the Labrador starvation reports. It is doubtful if he were ever north of the Sugar Loaf in his life, and knows about as much of the poor isolated Labrador men's condition as I know of building one of England's Dreadnoughts. Did Newfoundland travel the coast of Labrador last winter or did Dr. Grieve, of Battle Harbor Hospital? I, as a fisherman, know Dr. Grieve. I have need of treatment from him. I found in Dr. Grieve a gentleman of the best kind, a skilled doctor, spending the best years of his life among the Labrador settlers, healing and teaching them to lead more useful and better lives. I ask Newfoundland what he is doing it for, not for larger fees, certainly not for honour. If for honour he would have been a politician and perhaps been sent to the King's Coronation. No, sir, self-sacrificing (for Christ sake) that is his motive. Newfoundland, your letter carried no weight with the people here, Dr. Grenfell is helping. In the first place, you make untruthful statements, through ignorance, of Dr. Grenfell's good work, spiced with bitterness against Dr. Grenfell's popularity with the fishermen.

I have known Dr. Grenfell since his first visit to the French Shore—nearly fourteen years ago, and do not want Newfoundland to tell me how or why Dr. Grenfell founded the Grenfell Mission. It is because we fishermen know and feel so proud of our hero missionary, and because Newfoundland knows he is a better man than I. This I also know, he was the first man with authority, with the exception of the Rt. Hon. Sir R. Bond, that tried and did put down the pauper's dole on this coast, knowing the people as he does he knows we are only too glad after a bad day to get food in order to tide us over a long winter. If the Mission has thrived and swollen into gigantic proportions I advise Newfoundland not to worry, but if he gets any worse to come to St. Anthony Hospital and Dr. John M. Little will soon remove the Newfoundland Mr. Bond in speaking of Dr. Little reminds me if Newfoundland was living on this coast and met Dr. Little, personally, or was under his skilled treatment at St. Anthony Hospital, I think he would bless Dr. Grenfell; if not for anything else he would be having such an eminent surgeon to take charge of his hospital.

Don't be uneasy, Newfoundland, the Grenfell Institute is going to be built and we fishermen are going to make it our home while in St. John's. Well done, Dr. Grenfell, go on and with your good work, build a city home for us, expose to the world how we have been treated in the past. When Newfoundland was born, perhaps he had a baby carriage to begin with, now he has an automobile. I began with a wheelbarrow and rodent, and now get a good trap and conic; but through Dr. Grenfell we are only beginning to start to live and make our legitimate claim on the powers that be for that which has for the past been denied us.

Dr. Grenfell is our Wellington, his battle ground is the French Shore and Labrador; and as a fisherman trying to be honest with God and man, truthful in my letters, I am sure the fishermen and others of this coast and Labrador will unite with me in saying to Dr. Grenfell and his co-workers, Drs. Little, Wakefield and Grieve and staff of trained nurses, "Fight the good fight with all thy might."

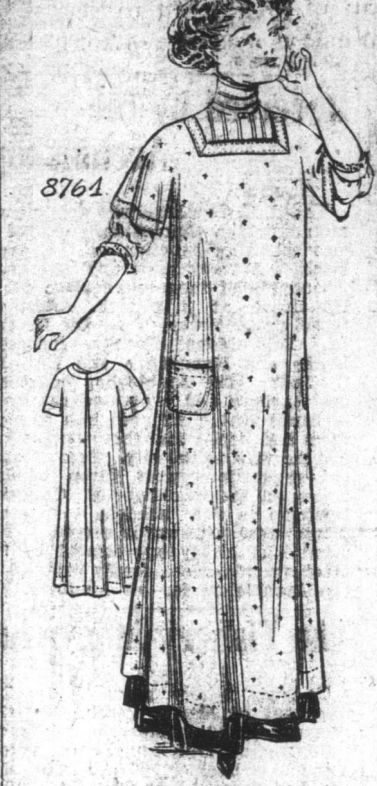

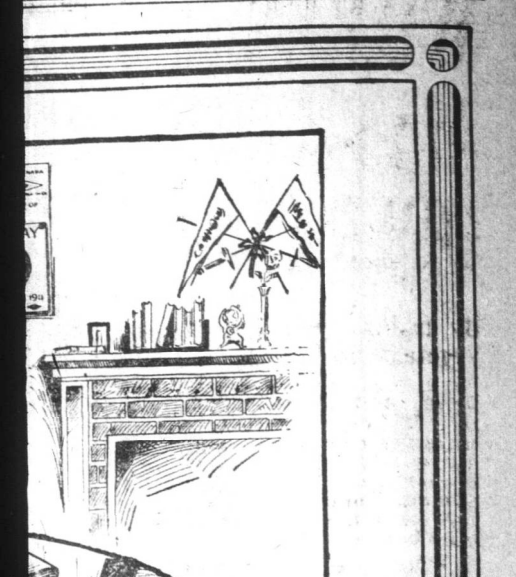
