

The month of June is noted for terrible earthquakes. On June 7, 1892, 3,000 persons were destroyed by an earthquake in Jamaica; on the same day of the same month in 1775, 40,000 persons perished in Persia by an earthquake; and on June 7, 1773, Santiago with its inhabitants was swallowed up. Several other instances of bad June earthquakes might be mentioned, one even so late as June 10, 1867, in Java, when 400 persons were destroyed.

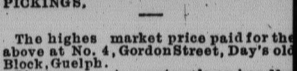
