BLEW COSSACKS TO BITS

Terrible Execution Done by a Bomb
in Warsaw Street.

St. Petersburg, May 2, 3:40 p.m. — Supplemental reports of the rioting in Poland yesterday received confirm the earlier Warsaw advice of the revolting cruelty of the Cossacks and other troops. People were driven into courtyards and beaten with the butts of revolvers, some of them into insensibility.

The bomb thrown into a Cossack patrol near the Vienna station, Warsaw, struck the head of a Cossack's horse, literally blowing the horse and rider to atoms and killing two other Cossacks and two men.

In Zembouff Hussars fired two volleys into the crowd.

At Loez a woman who was looking out of a window was shot by a Cossack.

While practically there were no disturbances in the Jewish cities on the Polish border, Southwestern Russia, dispatches this morning say that the people are in a state of panic. The streets are filled with moving patrols. The mill owners at Ryssostok fled in fear of their lives.

The situation is especially strained at Borisoff and Gomel.

MURDERING MOBS IN WINDY CITY

Stones, Clubs, Knives Used in
Fierce Fights in Chicago
Streets.

Chicago, Ill., May 2. — Fighting and rioting fiercer than on any previous day of the teamsters' strike was carried on in the business section of the city today. Stones, clubs, and knives were used with apparent abandon, and an accurate account of the injured cannot be obtained. As far as known one man was killed during the day. In the fight near the Auditorium Hotel his skull was fractured, and he was taken to a hospital, where he died. His name was Chas. Bear.

The strikers and their sympathizers attacked the non-union men at every opportunity, men being shot down within 200 feet of the retail store of Marshall, Field & Co., clubbed nearly to death at the corner of the Auditorium Hotel in plain view of hundreds of women, who were compelled to run from the mob to save their own lives.

In many instances, men walking along the streets who had no active connection whatever with the strike, were assaulted by hoodlums, who beat them first and later accused them of being strike-breakers. A notable instance of this kind was the case of K. Wheeler, pastor of a Presbyterian Church, who while on his way to the Pennsylvania depot was attacked by three men, who knocked him down and beat him until the police rescued him. One of the assailants was arrested.

Wm. Miles, a winemaker, who had been at work in a lunch room, half a mile from any former scene of rioting, was accused of being a strike-breaker. He was pounced on by a mob of about 20 men, who beat him down and trampled on him.

Resides these, 30 others are known to be injured, many of them strikers and non-union men. Three on the list of injured are policemen. One of the floor manager for Montgomery Ward & Co., who has been active in the interests of the strike, was attacked by three men, who he thinks had been following him for several days, while passing a vacant lot for the school.

Although it was announced last night that the Government would not interfere with the strike, the companies and of the Employers' Association would be handled by men armed with rifles and shotguns. In the kind was attempted, was in the case of fifteen drivers employed by the Swift Transfer Company. None of them was molested.

The strike today did not spread in any degree. No more men were called out, and from present appearances there is no immediate prospect that any more teamsters will strike.

Judge Kohlman, of the United States circuit court, at the request of attorneys representing seven companies, today issued a temporary injunction restraining all persons from interfering with or breaking the strike.

Pressure was brought to bear upon business houses with whom the teamsters have contracts. The team owners said they would not attempt to deliver coal to the city, because the strike is now in progress, because their own men would be called out. One thousand more police were sworn in today, upon the understanding by the employers that they would move 1,855 wagons tomorrow, manned by drivers.

Pistols and eggs filled with carbolic acid were used with a recklessness today that showed a new bitterness has been injected into the strike by the failure of all negotiations which were hoped yesterday might bring peace.

Riots on State street, at Adams street, near the new Government building, front of the Union League Club, and before the mayor's very windows, brought home to the people the danger of this city, as they went about their business today, the plight to which it is no longer a question of the main streets of Chicago in broad daylight with policemen scattered around.

The hamstringing of horses was a new form of cruelty devised and practiced by the strikers today. Over the backs of the dumb beasts of burden, who are unwittingly helping to break the strike, the employers hope to get revenge upon the employers for whom they won't work.

CONNAUGHT OPPOSES IT

But Desires for British-Spanish Alliance May Overrule Objections.

London, May 1. — The prospect of having a king for a son-in-law does not seem to be a great thing to the Duke of Connaught, whose daughter, the Princess Margaret Victoria, has been selected to be the future consort of King Alfonso of Spain, according to court rumors.

The Duke of Connaught is a fond father and a devoted grandfather. He is a youthful King, and not altogether a promising one. He wishes to be certain that the premature drop of wild oats which the King seems to be industriously sowing has been repaid by the young ruler's fluency toward causing the young ruler to "settle down" and recognize the responsibilities that rest upon the head that wears a crown.

It is believed that King Edward favors the match. Rumor has it that the English sovereign especially declares an alliance between his family and the reigning house in Spain. The Duke of Connaught, who has been married for 30 years, has a marriage which checks the ambitions of Kaiser Wilhelm, who has industriously sought to form an alliance between King Alfonso and some of the young German princes.
