All that remained for today's proceedings was the receipt of the President's veto of the cotton tariff revision bill, the final attempt of the tariff without waiting for the report and recommendations of the President's tariff board.

The House already had created a committee to notify the President that Congress was ready to adjourn and the Senate did likewise.

The veto message, with the vetoed bill, will be referred at once to the House ways and means committee, and then Congress will mark time to the fixed hour of adjournment. Particular objection had been made to the testimony of Barbella, who swore that he had seen Guiseppe Salvi, one of the defendants, leave the Cuoccolo home after the assassination of Maria Cuoccolo, whose murder followed that of her husband. The jury cross-examined the witness closely, and when the jurors noted many discrepancies between that and his verbal testimony, they decided that he was not sincere, and that the evidence given by him could not be depended upon.
