PREMIER CONFERS WITH COLLEAGUES

Ministers in Conference at Ottawa—Portfolios May Be Fewer.

Ottawa, Dec. 10.—A lengthy conference took place today between Premier Mackenzie King, Hon. J. A. Robb, minister of finance, and Hon. Vincent Massey and Hon. Herbert Marsh, ministers without portfolio.
The discussion, which took place in the premier's office, lasted for about three hours, but no announcement was forthcoming at its conclusion. Mr. King merely said that he was "talking some matters over" with the ministers. Reconstruction to take place following the opening of parliament in the event of the government securing a majority in the house of commons, may have been under consideration. Both Mr. Marsh and Mr. Massey were defeated at the general election, but it has been suggested that an effort would be made to find seats for them. It has been suggested that the premier is considering reducing the number of portfolios in the government by the amalgamation of certain departments now administered separately.

Shock Endangers Heroic Rescuer

Toronto, Dec. 10.—Brought on by his heroic rescue of a boy from the waters of the lake last month, Ernest Clark, returned soldier, is suffering in Christie street hospital from severe nervous smelt and is in a weak condition. His plunge into the icy water aggravated the complaint from which he has been suffering since his return from overseas, where he was severely gassed and shell-shocked. His wife and three children are in a precarious financial condition.

ST. MARYS BOARD TALKS COURSE IN AGRICULTURE

St. Marys, Dec. 10.—An important change may be made in the curriculum of the St. Marys college institute next term, if the suggestion of J. Tanton, science master, is carried out and the teaching of agriculture is substituted for botany and zoology in the first and second forms. This would entitle the school to receive quite a large sum in government agricultural grants. The matter was brought up at the regular meeting of the board.
The attendance report showed a total enrollment of 251, with an average attendance of 259.
A letter was received from the department of education to the effect that the school board has power to declare a holiday when they think it advisable. The matter of having an appraisal of the school property was left over to secure further information.
