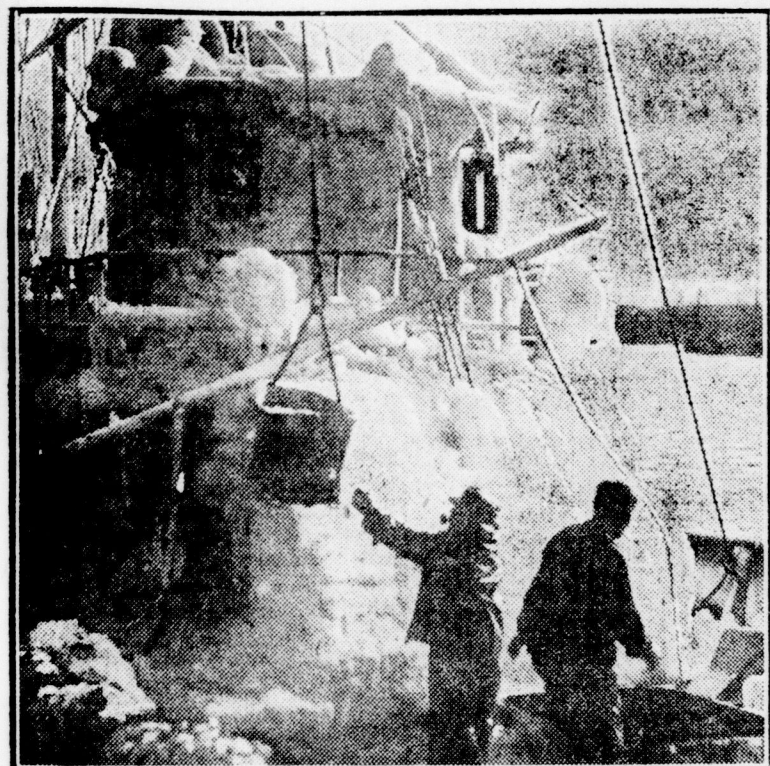
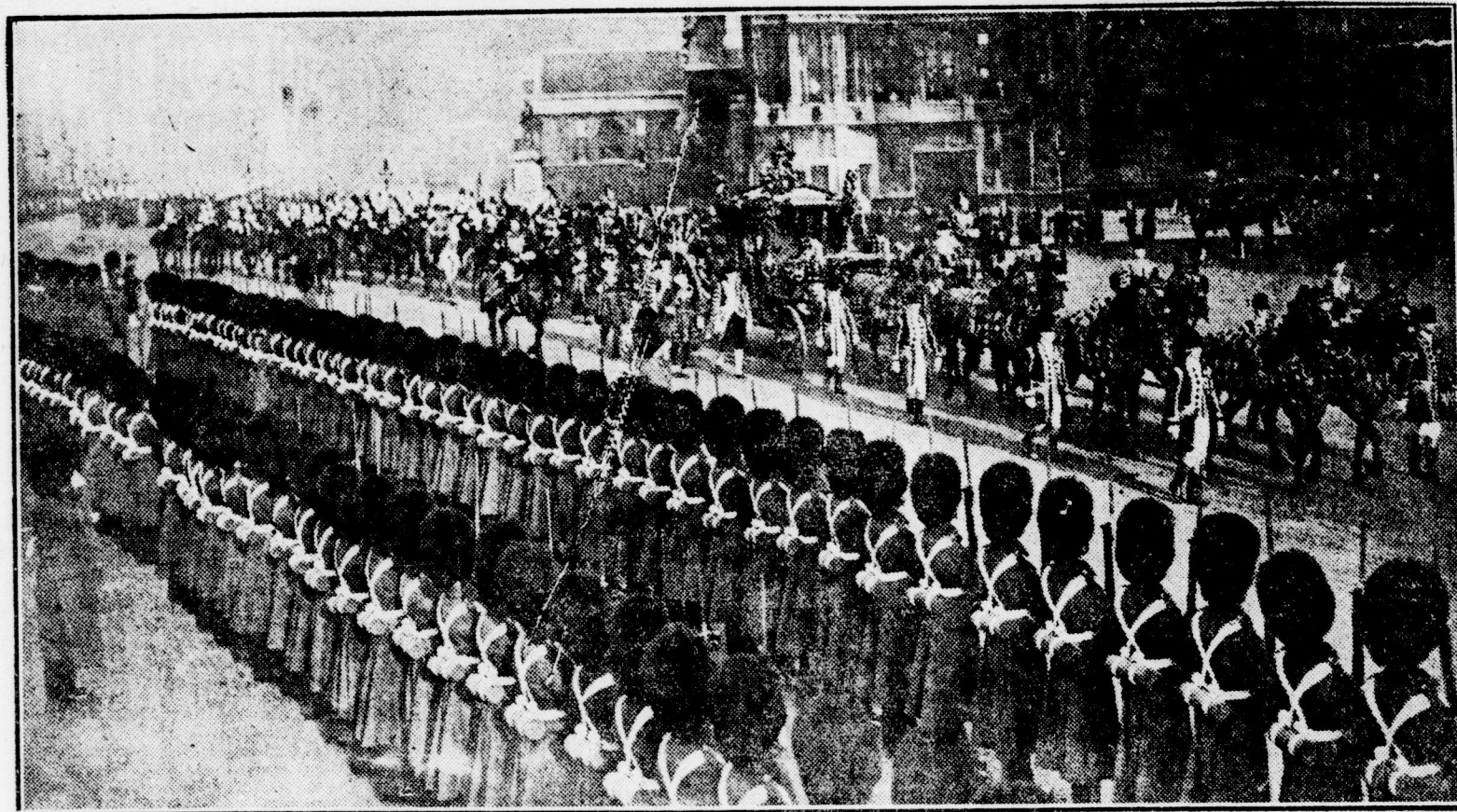


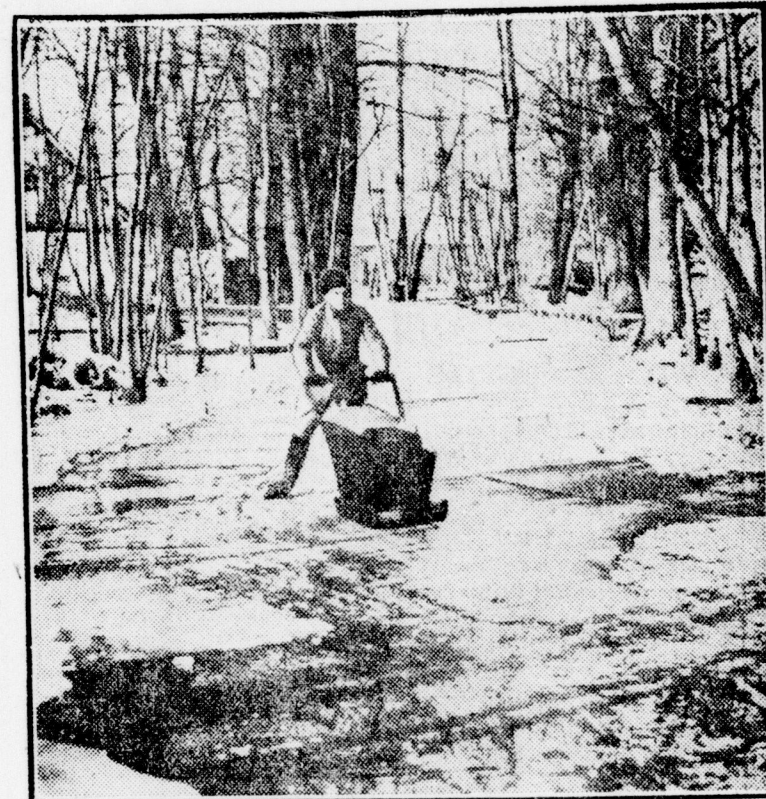
Herring-Bone Walk; Decorative Ships; Holds Canadian Honors



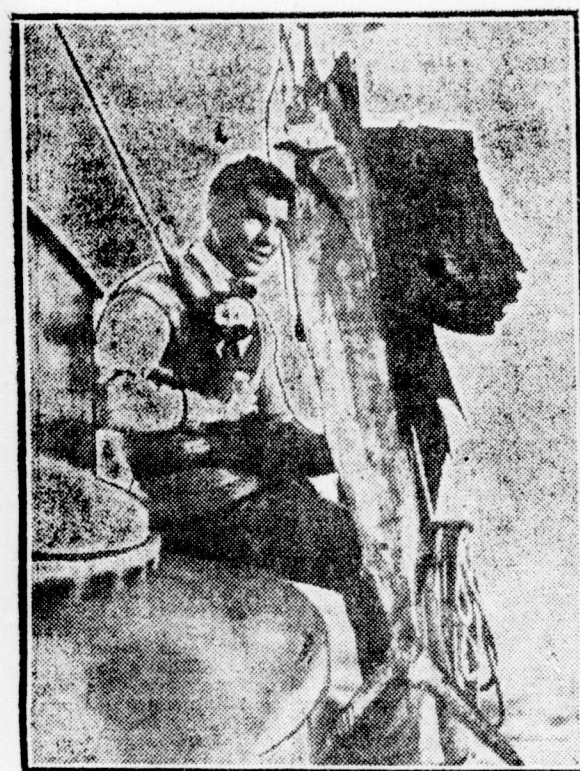

Extremes of large and small hats will predominate this spring is the announcement from Paris. This picture hat model is made of black taffeta and adorned about the brim with lattice work.



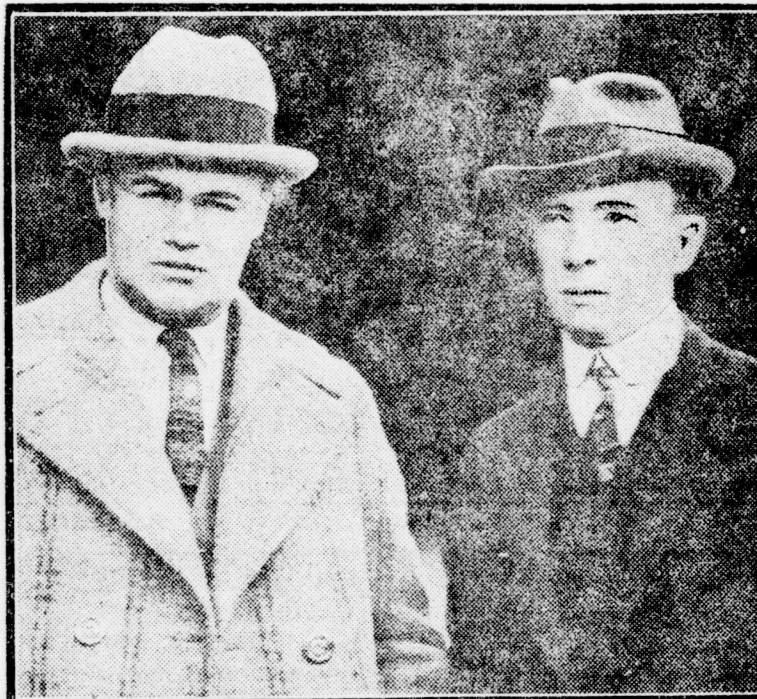

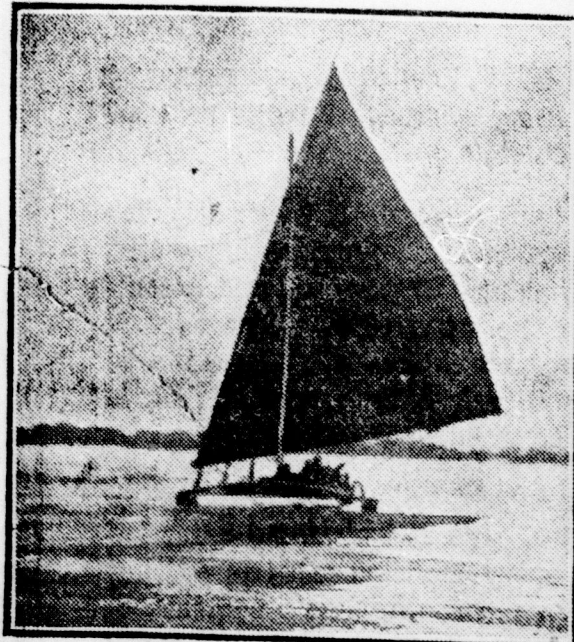
The first photograph of the fighting between the Obregon troops and the rebel army on the Guad-alajara front shows the government soldiers with their guns trained on the entrenched enemy.



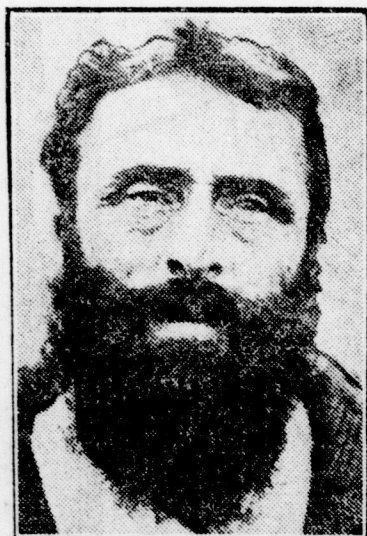

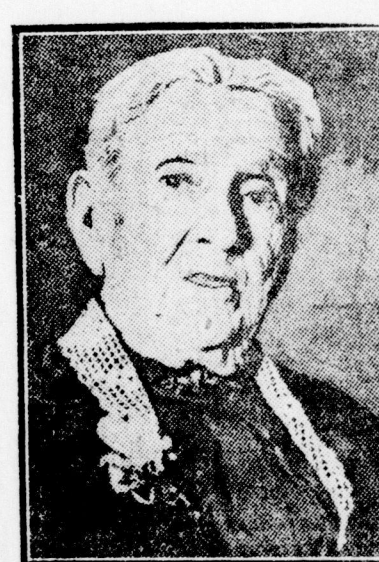
Ice-boating fans say that you don't know what speed and thrills are unless you have tried out their sport. This unusual photograph was taken in the early evening on Toronto bay
