The Emperor of Germany is an indulgent husband but a rather severe father. He believes in a soldierly training for his boys, such as he himself had. He makes an exception in the case of his only daughter, whom he affectionately styles his "Nesthaken" a term popularly employed in Germany for the last-born, and who habitually takes liberties with the dress of her lord which his own wife would shrink from.

The Thrifty German Empress.

While recently receiving a party of Americans, whom she had met before, the German Empress gave an illustration of how thrift is practiced by a royal mother. The royal household is allowed more than \$1,000,000 a year by the parliament for state receptions and public expenses, but the Emperor's home is maintained out of his own purse and the empress has control of this. She was talking with her visitors when a loud crash came from an adjoining room. Servants hastened to the spot, but the empress was there first.

On her return she said composedly to the company: "One of my nieces who has been visiting us broke a jardiniere, something I paid \$30 for because I liked its shape. She will have that much sewing to do to pay for her carelessness and my loss. The nice was given plain sewing and embroidery work to do, representing labor equivalent of the value of the ornamental jar—a lesson she was not likely to forget.

In showing her company through the royal home the empress brought them to the sewing-room, a place in which her daughter, her nieces and poor girls to whom she gives assistance work so many hours each day. Nearly all of the useful dress articles of the royal family are made in this room, which is fitted with machines, working tables and measuring apparatus. "We Germans," said the empress, with a pleasant smile, "try to avoid having idle little girls or women."
