This above is a cut of the new asylum for the harmless insane which has been erected in our town during the past year, and which is now occupied by some fifteen of these unfortunate patients.

To furnish all interested in this benevolent institution with a better idea of it as it now appears, we herewith annex a brief description. EXTERIOR OF BUILDING. The structure is 36x98ft. in length, three stories high, and is built of brick made by the Annapolis Brick and Tile Company, Ltd., of Bridgetown.

The interior contains ninety-one rooms, as follows:- The basement, or ground floor contains two general workrooms, one 36x14ft., and one 26x14ft.; two furnace and fuel rooms, one 11x20ft., and one 11x18ft.; fitted up with two sets of Rafter's "King" furnaces; a provision room 26x14ft.; two halls 26x7ft., and two halls 6x18ft.

water-closets 3x3 1/2 ft., and also a bed-room for superintendent 11x14 ft. Leading from this story are two flights of stairs, built of hard wood, while the floors are of matched hard wood.
