Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister or intending homesteader.

Duties. — Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties-Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent), and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

Simple Tests for Water.

Now that people are visiting the country, camping out, etc., it will be necessary for them to pass upon the purity of new supplies of water, a few trust-

worthy tests for this purpose, cuited from the 'Massachusetts Medical Journal,' are timely, especially as they are not based on chemical analysis.

First boil and fill a bottle made of colorless glass with the water and look through it at some dark object. The water should them appear perfectly colorless and free from suspended matter; a muddy or turbid appearance indicates the presence of soluble organic matter or of soluble matter in suspension.

If this test is passed successfully empty out some of the water, leaving the bottle about half-full; cork up and place it for a few hours in a warm place. Shake up the water, remove the cork and critically smell the air contained in the bottle. If it has any smell, and especially if the odor is in the least repulsive, the water should be rejected for domestic use. The advantage of heating the water is that this sometimes develops an odor that would not otherwise be perceptible.

Pure water should be tasteless and remain so after being warmed. It should also be odorless.

A very practical test for sewage contaminas

odorless.

A very practical test for sewage contamination or the presence of putrescible organic matter is as follows. A clean pint bottle is filled three-fourths full of the water to be tested, and in the water is dissolved a teaspoonful of the purest sugar—loaf or granulated will answer. The bottle is then corked and kept in a warm place for two days. If after from twenty-four to forty-eight hours the water becomes cloudy or muddy it is unfit for domestic use. If it remains perfectly clear it is probably safe for use.—'Christian Work.'
