1. In all compatitions restricted to Active Lilitia and Enfield All Comers, inone but he Government ammunition shall be used. The ammunition so issued shall in no way oe tampered with...

2. In All Comers' any Rifle Competitions, inless otherwise specified, any ammunition nay be used.

### SIGHTING.
