TO CORRESPONDENTS.

All communications for the English Edition of this Journal to be addressed to the Editor, Drawer 250, Post Office, Montreal. Of course it is expected they will be post paid. And correspondence ought to be sent, except in special cases, before the 20th of every month.

We postpone to our next issue a very interesting communication from Mr. Daly, the Montreal Emigration Agent, to whom we are much indebted for the information given us. He says: out of every twenty applicants made to me I could not more than supply, on an average, of one to one and a half or one to fifteen. These applications did not only come from this city and district, but a great many from Western and Central Canada. The following average of wages was readily offered, female servants from \$3 to \$5 per month; male house servants \$8 to \$12; gardeners and coachmen \$10 to \$15; farm laborers from £20 to £30 per annum. The scarcity of this emigration I can only attribute to our having this year a much better class than in former years. Although increased at least 100 per cent over last year, still the greater part appeared to have a fixed destination on arrival in this country; those who had not sufficient means to enable them to do for themselves, the greater part who sought this office since the opening of the navigation, was more for the purpose of seeking information as to localities of lands, &c., which was afforded them on all occasions, and I am happy to say that a great many did purchase. In our next number we will give the correspondence in full with our remarks.
