## APPOINTMENTS TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CANADIAN INSTITUTE FOR INTERNATIONAL PEACE AND SECURITY (CIIPS)

The Right Honourable Joe Clark, Secretary of State for External Affairs, announced today the re-appointment of four Canadian Directors to the seventeen member Board of Directors of the Canadian Institute for International Peace and Security (CIIPS). These appointments are for three-year terms.

The four Directors are:

Mr. Dennis McDermott, President, Canadian Labour Congress;

Dr. John H. Sigler, Professor of Political Science, Carleton University; Vice-President, United Nations Association in Canada;

Dr. Lois Wilson, President, World Council of Churches; former Moderator of the United Church of Canada;

Mr. Gerald Wright, Vice-President, Canadian Donner Foundation; President, the Atlantic Council of Canada.

The Secretary of State for External Affairs also announced the appointments, for three-year terms, of two foreign Directors. They are:

Mr. Paul C. Warnke, former Chief U.S. Negotiator, Strategic Arms Limitation Talks (SALT); former Director, U.S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency;

Mr. Christoph Bertram, Editor of the Die Zeit newspaper, Hamburg, Federal Republic of Germany; former Director of the International Institute for Strategic Studies, London.

These appointments were made after consultations with the Leader of the Official Opposition and the Leader of the New Democratic Party in accordance with the CIIPS Act (Bill C-32). The CIIPS was formally established on August 15, 1984 following a consensus of all parties in Parliament.
