Re BAR CURRICULUM CHANGES

Dear Mr. Principal: -

Powers of the General Council.

Under the Bar Act of the Province of Quebec a candidate for admission to the Bar must study as clerk or student with a practising advocate during at least four consecutive and entire years. This period is reduced to three years for students attending a "regular course of law" in a university of this province and to one year for those who have previously successfully completed such a law course. The General Council may from time to time determine the subjects which shall be studied and the number of lectures upon each subject in universities
