you to lift your frises and divide them at this time of the season. I think it is a little too late. If, however, you have already made the division, while waiting for an answer to your request (which we could not possibly reach before) then, we would simply advise an abundance of water. Do not forget that originally irises are water plants. You can never give them too much water. The more water given to the roots, the larger and richer and softer will be the bloom and coloring. If, however, you have not moved the roots, wait until early next spring. Then, as soon as the frost is out of the ground you may lift the roots, and make the division into as small roots as you desire. Decaying Hollyhocks. Yes, indeed, you are not by any means the only

you are not by any means the only one who has the same trouble to comone who has the same trouble to com-plain of. Since lower leaves are al-ready withered, yellowed, and curled up, nothing can be done to bring back their first healthy look. They will continue to fade until they drop off-unless you clip off all the faded leaves now. And that is what you had better

You should have used a spray of bordeaux mixture, early in the sum-mer. No good will be accomplished by spraying now. The mischief is blready done

already done. As soon as the flowers are gone to seed, cut the long stalks and lay the whole long stalk up in the attic or in some other unused spot where the sun may shine on the cut stalks and com-plete the drying of the seeds. They will mature just as well on the attic will mature just as well on the attic floor as out of doors on the stalk—in fact, we think better.

fact, we think better. In a short while after you have clipped off the stalks, new, fresh leaves will come up from the old roots. These will bear flowers next

year. Hunt up a former talk on hollyhocks, where the matter was taken up in full.


