A DOUBLE ROMP FOR THE DUNNITES

Morrisette Pitched Better Than McTigue in First—Russell Bested Manning

Both engagements of the double-header at the island Saturday resulted in decisive victories for the enemy, the counts reading 5 to 0 and 5 to 1 in favor of Richmond. Neither game was at all close, and it seemed like a romp for the Dunnites all the way. They started to score right off the bat in both contests, and maintained a good lead throughout.

Morrisette pitched a better game than McTigue in the first, and the Leafs had many chances to score, having men on in every inning but one, they were unable to hit when most needed, and were blanked in every inning. McTigue got their first hit in the third, and Daley the second in the sixth. On the other hand, Richmond's hits came in bunches, and, with two more runs than the Leafs got, they tallied five runs. Argon's single and Better's triple gave them one to the first. Trombley led off in the fourth with a one-base knock, and his team-mates helped him to make the circuit. Three successive runs in the fifth, aided by two fielders' choices, added three to their total, and it remained that way to the finish.

In the second, Russell was much better than Manning, who had an off-day. Manning had difficulty in getting them over, and was in trouble from the start. The first man up walked, and a single, a sacrifice, followed by another safe hit, scored two. Three passes and a bad throw gave the enemy another in the third. Jordan's double and two singles added one more in the fourth. Cook replaced Manning in the sixth and did better, but a couple of safe hits, one a triple by Argon, put over the fifth run in the seventh. In the meantime the Leafs could not muster more than one hit in any one inning, and so failed to score, until Gilbert came to the rescue and dropped one in the bleachers and made the circuit. The bleacher fans were of material help in this, as but for the catch would likely have been made.

Argon was the star of the day with the bat, getting three hits in each game, one a triple. The Richmond infield all had a good day, and scrubbed everything coming thru their territory.

Finn Beat Millard in Sensational Five Mile Run—American Championship.

SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Aug. 7.—Athletes of the Olympic Club, San Francisco, won the senior A. A. U. track and field championship at the Panama-Pacific Exposition today. They scored 30 points, as more than the Irish-American Athletic Club of New York. The Illinois Athletic Club was third, with 21 points; the Chicago Athletic Association had 17; Kansas City A. C., 13; University of Wisconsin, 11; Los Angeles A. C., 10; Monmouth A. C., 10; New York 3, 5 and University of Chicago, 7.
