

MORE DARING RAIDS CARE OF SOLDIERS BY FRENCH AVIATORS REGARDING LIQUOR

Asphyxiating Gas Factory at Dornach One of Places Attacked.

IN WOEVRE DISTRICT SOME DRASTIC ACTION

Bombs Dropped on Several Stations—All Aviators Returned Safely.

PARIS, Aug. 27.—Further air raids on a large scale by French aviators were officially reported today. The operations, which were carried out last night and early this morning, were chiefly in the Woevre region, and along the railways used by the enemy to supply the armies of the Crown Prince and those fighting before Metz.

Half a dozen German railway stations and factories were attacked, including the gas factory at Dornach, and at Ivry and the big asphyxiating gas plant at Dornach. At Mulheim railway station, electric light plants and other buildings were bombed.

Official Statement.—“During the night of August 26 our aviators bombed St. Baustant and Essey, in the Woevre district. In the Aronne section, the railroad stations of Ivry and Clerges also were bombed by French aeroplanes. This followed an attempt on the part of German aviators to bomb the town of Aronne. The bombs thrown down on this position, however, by the Germans caused no damage.

“During the night of August 26-27, a French aviator threw down ten shells on a factory at Dornach, where the Germans have been manufacturing asphyxiating gases.

“During the morning of today, a French squadron of aeroplanes bombed the railroad station and the electric power house at Mulheim, in the Grand Duchy of Baden.

“All the aviators returned unharmed.”

HESPERIAN LANDED CANADIANS SAFELY

Sixteen Hundred Men, Including Royal Canadian Dragoons, Reach Port.

OTTAWA, Aug. 27.—It is officially announced that the Hesperian, which sailed from Canada on Aug. 17, has arrived at Liverpool, England, with the following drafts of reinforcements:

Royal Canadian Dragoons, 2 officers and 15 men; Horse Artillery, 2 officers and 15 men; Infantry, 4 officers and 100 men; Engineers, 3 officers and 100 men; Signaller, 1 officer and 50 men; Infantry from Ontario, 2 officers and 120 men. Other details, 3 officers and six men.

ONSCRIPTION BEFORE CABINET OF BRITAIN

Lord Kitchener Said to Have Expressed Views to Special Committee.

LONDON, Aug. 27.—The Daily Chronicle says a committee of the cabinet, consisting of Lord Curzon, Lord Curzon, Winston Churchill, Austen Chamberlain and Arthur Balfour, is holding an enquiry as to the advisability and feasibility of conscription.

Lord Kitchener has given evidence before the committee, as have other ministers, members and officials, and the committee will report to parliament in the middle of September.

An estate of \$2,432 was left by Mrs. Mary McMillan, who died at Stouffville. Her son, Joseph Mertens, will get the bulk of the estate. A grandchild, George Edward Mertens, will also share.

Mrs. Mary Brooker left an estate of \$394. She died July 28. Her husband, Morris Brooker, and six children will divide the property.
