Great Patches of Forest Declared to Be Affected and Doomed to an Early Death by Dominion Geologists—Hon. Mr. Cochrane to Inquire.

Ottawa, Jan. 23.—Officials of the Dominion geological survey have made the sensational announcement that a blight has struck the great pine forests of the Temagami district.

They say that great patches of the grand white pines are losing their foliage through some unknown cause.

In some cases the entire foliage of gigantic trees is so affected that in others the enemy had only attacked patches, but in all cases appearances pointed to the early death of the trees which would expose them in a year or two to the ravages of the "borer."

The discovery of the blight was made by Dr. Barlow and W. J. Wilson of the geological survey, both of whom were engaged during last summer in different parts of the Temagami country.

Dr. Barlow communicated his observations upon his return to Hon. Mr. Cochrane, provincial minister of mines and timber, who expressed his intention of looking into the matter.
