



THE NICARAGUA CANAL.

The construction of the Nicaragua Canal is the next great work which the United States will undertake. The Morgan Bill, which provides for the work, will be given precedence over all other legislation, both in the Senate and the House of Representatives. The policy of the administration is to push the work along as fast as possible. It is expected that the canal can be completed in six years, and a maximum of \$115,000,000 is to be appropriated for the purpose.
