WANT TO DAM THE NIAGARA
U. S. Congress May Invite Great Britain to Join in Restoring Lake Levels.
AN INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION
To Report on the Work—Would Raise Water in Lake Erie Two or Three Feet.

Washington, D.C., March 9.—Among the provisions of a bill reported to the House on Monday is one which relates to the building of a dam across the Niagara River at the outlet of Lake Erie. The bill also provides for the formation of an international commission to be composed of three members from the United States and three from the government of Great Britain to represent the Dominion of Canada. The duty of this commission shall be among other things to report upon the advisability of locating a dam in the Niagara River at the outlet of Lake Erie with a view to determining whether such a dam will benefit navigation. If such a structure is deemed advisable, the commission shall make recommendations to their respective governments looking to an agreement or treaty that shall provide for the construction of the dam. The commission shall also make estimate of the probable cost of the work.

Should such an international commission agree upon the building of a dam, it will compel the building of a dam across the Niagara River at the outlet of Lake Erie as far west, it is believed, as the Detroit River, without doing any damage, because it will merely raise the level of the lake to what it formerly was. When the water rises above that point it will flow over the dam through the sluiceways.

A Boulder Crushed Them.
Quebec, March 9.—A shocking accident occurred at Riviere a Poudre, County of Portneuf, Friday morning, through which two workmen of the place named Plamondon and Lacoste, who were feared, lost their lives, as both of them are now in a critical state. The accident occurred about 10 o'clock, when the huge boulder, which was being hauled down a grade, passed over both. They were unconscious when carried to their homes, and had every appearance of having sustained grave injuries. Both Plamondon's legs were broken, while Lacoste's injuries were about his chest, over which the stone rolled.

Rev. Dr. Smith Dead.
Halifax, N.S., March 9.—The death occurred here on Saturday afternoon of Rev. Dr. Watson Smith, D.D., LL.D., aged 65 years, after an illness of a little over a week with pneumonia. The deceased was possessed of great literary talent. He was of a very kindly disposition and highly esteemed. He was a devoted husband, and had two sons and two daughters.

YORK COUNTY AND SUBURBS

Remarkable Activity in Real Estate Noticeable at the Junction This Spring.

BRICK SCARCE FOR BUILDING

Stock Yards Company Moving Sixty Houses—Many Lots Changing Hands.
Toronto Junction, March 9.—Mr. Ball of New Ontario lectured before the Lithia Club on Saturday night. He illustrated his lecture with a map of the northern country. W. J. Hill, M.L.A., and Archibald Campbell, M.P., were also speakers.

With the first sign of spring there is a recurrence of that activity in building operations that characterized the closing months of last year.

For the first time in many years there is no brick to be had in the yards around Toronto Junction. The yards here do not manufacture pressed brick, which can be made the year round, and it will be some time before the brick can be put on the market. In the meantime, builders in the Junction, who do not purchase earlier, are buying a pressed brick, which is shipped here from Milton. Mr. Hill is building two residences of this brick at the corner of Keele and Annette-streets. Mr. Toivell purposes building on the corner of Annette-street and Keele-street. Mr. Rhodes will build two houses on Midland-street, north of the Presbyterian church. Mr. Pearson has the foundation dug for a house on the corner of Clendenan and Annette-street, and will build others later this season. The building of the C.P.R. contemplates building on Cavithra-avenue, and Archibald McKinnon will build on Gilmore-avenue. Mr. Boucher has contracts for three or four houses in the southern part of the town, which he will commence as soon as the frost is out of the ground, and on every hand there are indications for a lively spring.

The United Stock Yards Company are moving 60 houses from the streets west of the streets east of Keele-street and have four or five waiting for the foundation to be dug, and are anxious to get about in the vicinity of Keele and Cavithra-avenues. Real estate values here are firm this spring, and there are many indications for a lively spring.

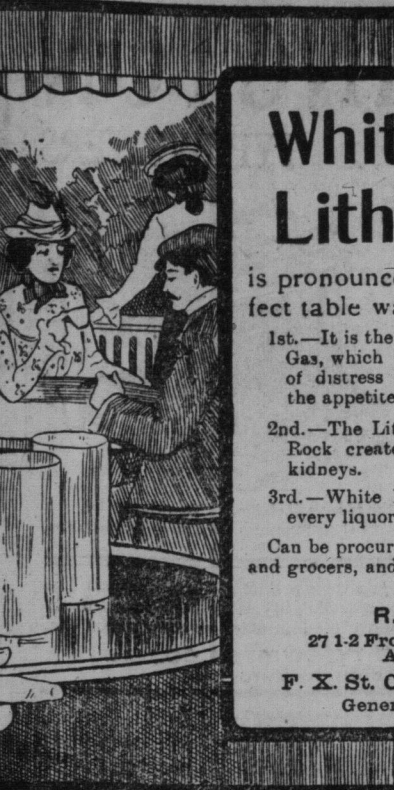
