BOY'S LIFE SAVED BY QUICK ACTION OF SUPERINTENDENT

Willie McConnell Caught by High-Speed Belt in Mill.

Caught by a belt moving at terrific speed, and hurled to what looked like certain and horrible death in the cog-wheels of a machine, Willie McConnell, of 241 Ridout street, was saved by the quick action of Foreman Gandy at the Quaker Oats Mills yesterday. As it was, a large part of the boy's shoulder and his side from under his arm down to the waist were cruelly chewed by the teeth of the wheels, and he had several teeth knocked out, but he was pulled to safety just in the nick of time.

Just how the accident happened no one knows. McConnell says he knew nothing of danger until he was jerked off his feet and hurled against the wheels. Apparently his coat caught in the swiftly-moving belt and he was helpless. Foreman Gandy happened to be close by, and as soon as the boy struck the machine he grabbed him by both feet, and by a mighty effort snatched him from a terrible death. Two seconds more and it would have been too late, those who saw the accident say, McConnell was taken home and attended by Dr. H. Hogg. His injuries will confine him to the house for many weeks.

ONLY STERN FIGHTING WILL SAVE ENGLAND FROM GERMAN CLAWS

Allied Victory, However, Will Restore Belgium and France.

Reconstruction after the war was dealt with by Rev. Canon Tucker, D. D., at the afternoon session of the Rural Deanery Chapter of East Middlesex, in St. George's Church, West London. He drew two pictures of the war's outcome. The first depicted a German victory, with Belgium, Holland, Denmark and part of France annexed by Germany, Asia under the rule of Turkey, and England and France as Germany's vassals. Stern fighting and sacrifice, he said, would be needed to prevent this result.

Dealing with the outcome in event of an Allied victory, which he was confident would come in spite of Russia's failure and the submarine campaign, he said that Belgium and France would be restored. Poland would be self-governing. The Turk would be driven from Europe, and the Dardanelles become international. Asia Minor and the Euphrates valley would be under Allied control.

At the evening session Mr. Mason delivered an interesting illustrated lecture on the value of the lantern in the Sunday school.

A plea for better Sunday school literature was made by Rev. A. A. Bice, Anglican Sunday school children, he said, came in contact with those of other denominations, who possessed Sunday school literature of a high and interesting type. Trading their smaller papers for these, they often became interested in the other churches, and in many instances eventually became members.

MANY PROBATIONERS
WERE EXAMINED BY
METHODIST BOARD

Rev. A. G. Harris Is Retiring
After Fifty-Three Years' Service.

Examination of probationers and the annual examination of the character and teachings of the ministers of the London Methodist district, as provided for in the discipline of the church, occupied the greater part of the day sessions yesterday of the last district meeting before conference.

An interesting and impressive incident of the afternoon was the application for superannuation by Rev. A. G. Harris of Thamesford, who has been in the ministry for 53 years. Referring to his experiences in the long years of service for the church, Mr. Harris stated that, with the exception of three years in the Toronto conference, the whole time had been devoted to ministerial work within the bounds of the London conference, and some fifteen years in the London district. He was received as a candidate at a district meeting held in North Street Church in May, 1864. It was a rather remarkable coincidence that Rev. James Kennedy of this city, who was present at yesterday's meeting when Mr. Harris applied for superannuation, was a member of the board that examined and approved him for a candidate 53 years ago. Mr. Harris was ordained by Rev. Dr. Pugh in Kingston in 1864.

Four Approved.
Four young men were examined and approved, Eric L. Anderson, Charles E. Taylor, Sidney Davidson and E. C. Chamberlain. Mr. Davidson was recommended for ordination at the conference which will be held in Dundas Centre Church in June. W. H. Moss was examined and, after telling the story of his religious life, the ministry recommended as a candidate.

The statement was made that the following probationers of the London district have enlisted for overseas service: J. C. McLeod, Wm. M. Skilling, Richard S. Hasking, Ernest E. Everingham, J. Morley, Colling, Wm. Manning, Frederick Manning and C. Elmer Taylor. The last, who has just recently enlisted, was present at the meeting to the conference that these young men be allowed to engage in military service.

Patriotic Meeting.
The first hour of the evening session was devoted to a patriotic prayer meeting, conducted by Rev. J. E. Holmes, chairman of the district, several of the ministers taking part. A number of laymen were also present, and the ministerial sessions having ended yesterday afternoon, will take part in the general sessions today.

The subject of a conference-wide evangelistic campaign, following the Manchester services held in several of the districts in the past year, was introduced by F. B. Holtby of St. Thomas, and approved. Further discussion in regard to this will take place today. The statistical reports for the past year will also be a feature of today's meeting which begins at 9:30 o'clock.

**RUSH OF RECRUITS
AT LOCAL ARMORIES;
FEW ARE REJECTED**
Daily recruiting figures for the past two days at the recruiting depot at the armories, where 80 men have applied for enlistment in the various units in this district. Out of the 80 men who applied, twelve were found to be unfit for military service, and the others were allotted to whatever unit their physical fitness would warrant.

On Monday 30 men applied to join at the armories, of whom two were unfit, and fourteen men were examined from outside points, of whom three were rejected as unfit, making a total for Monday of 44 applications.

On Tuesday eleven Londoners applied, and ten passed the medical tests, while in addition twenty-five came in from places outside the city, of whom six were unable to pass the medical examination. This made a total of thirty-six men on Tuesday.

The number of men rejected is remarkably small, and is attributable to the fact that men are now being accepted when they have slight physical defects which prevent them from joining units to serve in the front line trenches, and such men are now being allotted to units for which the physical requirements are not so exacting, but where they can perform equally important service.
