SAYS PENSIONS FOR MOTHERS TO COST \$900,000

Riddell Report, Handed To Ontario Government, Estimates For Three Years.

CONDITIONS SUGGESTED Widows, Wives of Insane or Disabled Men, Recommended As Eligible.

TORONTO, Feb. 19.—Dr. W. A. Riddell, deputy minister of labor for Ontario, today handed to the Government his report on mother's pensions, with recommendation for payment of mothers' allowances, based on an exhaustive investigation of the question. The estimated cost, allowing for approximately a three-year development as \$850,000. Dr. Riddell admits that his recommendations are comparatively conservative.

Among the conditions suggested in the report are the following:

"Allowances available for mothers of following conditions: (1) conjugal children should be issued under the act where the mother is a widow, wife of an inmate of a provincial hospital for the insane, or the wife of a man who is totally disabled; (2) the mother must be in every way a suitable guardian for her children.

"Only Certain Families.

"Allowances should be available only to families of two or more children who shall be under fourteen years of age and who shall be in the immediate care of their mothers.

"Further, the allowance shall only be paid when the father was a British subject, or the mother an English subject, and where the mother and children were actually resident in Canada at the time of application and for a period of two years immediately preceding the time of application and residence in Ontario of the family while in receipt of allowance.

"The allowance is to be paid where the mother and dependent children do not own property valued at more than \$2,000, and where the children are dependent upon their mother for support.

"The amount of the allowance is to be determined by the commissioner to be appointed, after receiving the recommendation of investigating officers.

"Cost of Administration.

"The cost of administering the act is to be borne by the provincial Government, but one-half of the amount is to be a direct charge upon the municipalities in which the beneficiaries have established residence for at least a year.

"The report recommends administering the act under strong central control with local co-operation under a provincial commission composed of five members appointed by the lieutenant-governor-in-council, two of whom should be women, the members to serve without remuneration, except that a per diem allowance may be provided during the regular sessions. The term of the members should be five years. Dr. Riddell recommends, and arrangements should be made for one to retire each year.

Dr. Riddell reports that there are 16,448 widows in Ontario with children and 31,223 children of widows. There are 15,024 widows of British birth in Ontario, and 30,159 children of widows of British nationality.

WILSON MAINTAINS HIS FORMER STAND IN LATEST NOTE

Reply to Supreme Council Sent for Transmission.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19.—(By the Associated Press.)—President Wilson today prepared and sent to the state department a reply to the Entente powers' note on the Adriatic question. He is understood to have received the position of the American Government in less than two hours, it probably will not be put on the cables before tomorrow night or Saturday. An important part of the note is that it might be transmitted tonight.

Was Sent to Paris.

The original note was prepared by the president was sent to Acting Secretary of State Polk for his personal study, as he was head of the Adriatic mission when the Adriatic settlement of December 9 was reached at Paris, and is, therefore, familiar with all the preliminary negotiations.

The president is understood to have adhered to the position taken in his note of February 10, in which he informed the Allies that if they were to proceed to a settlement of the Adriatic question without the participation of the American Government, a situation might be created where the United States might have to consider whether it could become a party to the treaty of Versailles and the Franco-American pact.

Note Was Argumentative.

While conciliatory, the president's reply to the original note was argumentative. Mr. Wilson in his answer is understood to have met this argument point to point and is believed to have again called attention to the principle of self-determination as enshrined in the American Declaration of Independence during the war, which was accepted by the Central Powers as the basis for peace.

ELEVEN COUNCILLORS AND IRISH ALDERMAN ARE HELD IN PRISON

LONDON, Feb. 19.—(By the Canadian Press.)—Questions to Premier Lloyd George in the House of Commons today elicited the Irish weekly cost of British forces in the Ottoman territory amounted to £754,350.

The reports of experts on the channel tunnel scheme are being considered. In future the Government states there will be some organized celebration on Empire Day.

The Government has made it quite plain that they would not allow an offensive by Polish forces in Russian territory.

The Irish secretary stated in the House of Commons today that an Irish alderman and eleven councillors were held in prison. The lord mayor of Dublin had been released.

The war emergency continuance bill was debated on the retail state bill and will be further considered Tuesday next.

DENEKINE ONLY ONE GETTING AID

LONDON, Feb. 19.—Premier Lloyd George was asked whether aid, financial or otherwise, was still being given to any Russian army or organization, whose aim was the overthrow of the Bolsheviks.

The premier replied that no aid was being given except that the Government was continuing as far as circumstances would permit to fulfill its remainder of its obligations to Gen. Denekine.

Replying to a question as to whether Great Britain was trying to bring about peace between the Soviet Russia and Poland, Mr. Lloyd George said the

CHURCH WILL FIGHT CASE TO PRIVY COUNCIL

WINDSOR, Feb. 19.—Prepared to carry the case to the privy council, the highest tribunal in the Empire, counsel for the congregation of St. George's Memorial Church, Weymouth, announced tonight that an appeal against the judgment of Justice Kelly, ordering the church torn down, will be filed with the appellate division of the Ontario supreme court.

The judgment of the justice who heard the evidence in the case at Sandwich came like a thunderbolt to the Anglican congregation this afternoon. The suit was brought by Lord Paine, a Windsor real estate operator, against Frederick Wallworth and Wallace M. Campbell, members of All Saints' Episcopal Church. Paine alleged that the church has been erected contrary to the building restrictions. In his judgment Justice Kelly said that the church was erected in violation of the restrictions and ordered its demolition.

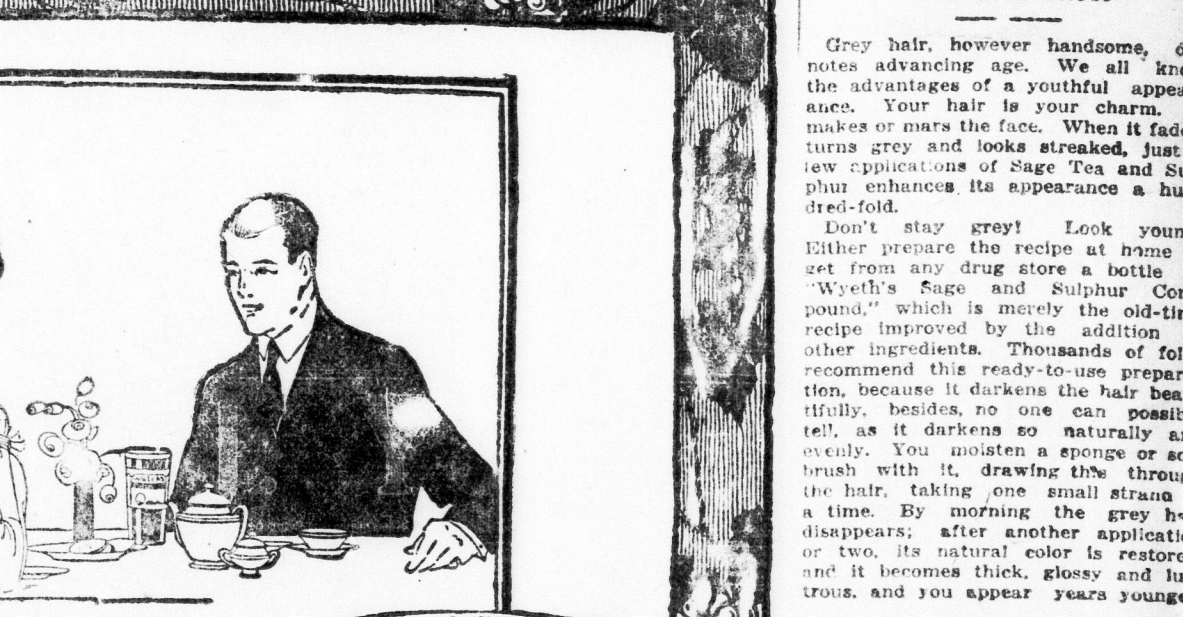
