

Also to the Rev. J. Breeding, Beaver Harbour, £75. and to the Rev. W. Jarvis, Guysboro, £25, and the usual grant for a travelling missionary on the Western coast of Nova Scotia.

It was moved by Capt. Ousely, seconded, and Resolved—

That the Society will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an assistant missionary appointed to a separate cure, unless the people there consent to pay toward the endowment fund of their Parish or mission all the proceeds of whatever Glebe Lands may be in that Parish.*

It was moved by the Rev. T. C. Leaver, and seconded.

That the Bishop be invited to request the Clergy to have an annual collection in their Churches in aid of the funds of the Endowment Sub-Committee.

It was moved in amendment by Rev. T. H. White, seconded by A. M. Uniacke, Esq.

That the Endowment Sub-Committee be requested before any further action is taken, to submit a plan for the distribution of the funds.

The amendment was put and passed.

It was the opinion of the Society that the next Public Meeting be at the same time of the year with the annual meeting.

The meeting adjourned.

PUBLIC MEETING.

A Public Meeting of the Society was held at the Temperance Hall on Tuesday evening, 6th March, 1855.

The Lord Bishop took the Chair at 7 P. M.

The Venerable the Archdeacon read the Prayers appointed for the use of the Society.

The Bishop in his introductory address gave a brief sketch of the present position of the Society, and the advance it was making in various parts of the Diocese.

The Secretary read an abstract from the minutes of the Society's proceedings during the past year.

The Honble W. Rudolf, in the absence of the Chief Justice, who was unable to attend, moved the first Resolution, which was seconded by W. C. Silver, Esq.

Resolved, That the blessings which have hitherto attended the Missionary labours of the Society, call for our thankfulness to Almighty God, and should
