GEORGETOWN .- Rev. R. Roach, reports that during the current year the sum of £42 17s 5d has been collected for the purpose of paying off a debt on Trinity Church and other incidental expenses, and £55 subscribed towards the minister's salary; that arrangements have been made for properly enclosing the church property early the ensuing summer, and the sum of £7 10s allowed by your Society to the missionary has been handed over by him in furtherance of that object, and that a valuable clock has been given by Capt. Westaway for the use of the church. At Murray Harbour the grant made by your Society has been expended in repairing the church and making it fit for the celebration of public worship; he further reports, that through the Divine blessing a permanent attachment to the ministrations of the church is clearly apparent in the cong-gation of Georgetown; and in Murray Harbour the most kindly feeling is evinced towards the occasional services of the church by the full attendance and devout attention of the people, and also that the religious services held frequently at Montague, Cardigan, &c., are encouraging evidences of an enlightened appreciation of the Episcopal church and her evangelical offices.
