MILITANTS OUT FOR VENGEANCE

Arrest of Mrs. Pankhurst Results in Two Large Fires, With Others Promised.

LONDON, Dec. 6.—The campaign of vengeance for the re-arrest of Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst was started in earnest by the militant suffragettes in the course of last night. They had marked for destruction the exhibition buildings and the grand stands of the race tracks in Lancashire, where Premier Asquith is spending the weekend in delivering a series of political speeches.

Two of the items on the militant suffragettes program were successfully carried out for "arson squads" set fire to and burned down exhibition buildings at Liverpool and Manchester. Their third attempt, however, was unsuccessful, the destroyers being frightened away by the approach of a policeman when they were preparing their combustibles to set fire to the grand stand on Aintree race course.

Exhibition Burned.
MANCHESTER, Eng., Dec. 6.—The Exhibition Hall in the southeastern suburban district of Rusholme, which cost \$60,000, was burned to the ground by an "arson squad" of militant suffragettes today. The incendiaries left the usual suffrage literature strewn about, and a note addressed to Premier Asquith, reading: "This is your welcome to Manchester and Oldham."

Surround Jail.
EXETER, Eng., Dec. 6.—Exeter jail was today surrounded by militant suffragettes in anticipation of the removal of their leader, Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst. A number of automobiles were at hand ready to give chase in case the prisoner should be taken to some other jail.

PARIS, Dec. 6.—(Can. Press).—The French cabinet crisis brought about by the resignation of Premier Barthou, after his defeat in the chamber of deputies on the question of the finance bill, was still unsolved this morning. Jean Dupuy, after consulting his political friends, having informed President Poincaré that he must decline the task of forming a cabinet.

ROUMANIAN PRINCE JOINS GERMAN ARMY

Grandson of King Will Enter First Foot Guards at Potsdam.

BERLIN, Dec. 6.—(Can. Press).—Prince Charles, eldest son of the crown prince of Roumania, is to enter the German army on Jan. 1 as lieutenant in the First Foot Guards at Potsdam in order to complete his military education. The prince, who is twenty years old, is to remain two years with the regiment.

SIX-YEAR SENTENCE FOR MANSLAUGHTER
PORT ARTHUR, Ont., Dec. 6.—(Can. Press).—The case of the King v. Nick Scarfo, the Italian who is charged with murdering a fellow-countryman on the Port William road on Nov. 10, was resumed today in the court of sessions. The judge sentenced the prisoner to serve six years in Stony Mountain after the jury brought in a verdict of manslaughter.

DUKE OF CONNAUGHT VISITS SALVATION ARMY INSTITUTES

His Royal Highness Warns Canada Against the Ever-Increasing Urban Population.

HONEST REPLY PLEASES GOVERNOR-GENERAL

MONTREAL, Dec. 6.—(Can. Press).—A warning against a calamity which he said was threatening Canada at the present moment and which should be averted was given by His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught in his reply to an address which was made to him at the Salvation Army headquarters on University street yesterday after he had inspected two of the army's homes and other institutions for the aid of the friendless and destitute in Montreal. This, he said, lay in the ever-increasing urban population, and if this question were not speedily dealt with stunts would be formed and Canada would have a problem of the unemployed similar to that of Europe.

At the Salvation Army metropolis, the duke after seeing the chef, said: "An old army man?" The chef replied that he was and added: "Served 21 years, your highness."

Further questioning brought out that he was John Hurley, gunner with the Royal Garrison Artillery. He had seen service in China and had been stationed abroad for eleven years. "What rank?" he was asked. "I was bombardier once," said he, "but I was reduced for bad conduct."

The straightforward honest reply pleased the duke immensely, and he once more shook the duke by the hand.

This morning the duke visited the art gallery and made a careful survey of the selection of pictures of the Royal Canadian Academy there.

He engaged in a long conversation on Canadian art with Herbert Brymner, the president of the R. C. A., and members of the Montreal Art Association.

The exhibition contains several pictures by the Princess Patricia.
