While we can tabulate the sales of the Colporteurs, and the number of copies given as gratuities by them to those found destitute of the Scriptures in their homes, we leave the great results of the circulation of the Word of God to Him who has declared: "So shall My word be that goeth out of My mouth: it shall not return unto Me void, but it shall accomplish that which I please, and it shall prosper in the thing whereto I sent it."
