SHOP GIRLS ANXIOUS TO GET GARDEN PLOTS

Dwellers in "Third Floor Back" Wish To Grow Produce For Sale

Must Find Market—Free-Garden-Plot Movement Brought Face to Face With Unique Problem

(Toronto Star)

"Well, I think women are just too wonderful for words!"

"Why, of course they are, but why this sudden enthusiasm on the subject?"

"I was just considering all the changes to which they have adapted themselves since the war, and the absolutely new work they have cheerfully undertaken and the success they have nearly always made of it. And now they are gaily taking up the project of back-yard gardening. I've just heard Miss Yates tell of the plans that are being made along these lines."

"To begin with, will you please tell me just why this campaign is being inaugurated?"

"Simply to produce more food. Last year the vegetable crop was very poor—the average yield per acre was very low. Now, the army alone needs an enormous amount for the regulation ration is one pound of potatoes a day for each soldier. When you multiply that by the number of men and then work out how many bags it will require to cover the demand, the result—the necessary supply for the army alone—is rather appalling. On account of the shortage of labor it is impossible for the farmers to successfully cope with the problem. I shouldn't think the supplies from a small garden would help much."

Multiple Back Yards.

"Not from one small garden, certainly, but," as Miss Yates said, "multiply that by the number of back yards fit for cultivation in Toronto—add to that the area of ground now lying waste as vacant lots, and think of the result. Then remember, Toronto is only one city; think of the number of cities, towns, and villages in which the same thing will be done. It assumes larger proportions, doesn't it? Then, think, too, each family with a garden will be self-supporting as far as its vegetable supply goes. At a slight outlay in the spring, these people will have a supply of fresh vegetables all summer; will be able to eat enough to do a great part of the winter, to say nothing of those roots which will keep without any preserving being necessary, if that doesn't sound like thrift, what on earth does?"

"Yes, it's fine, but how are they going to get people to cultivate the vacant lots?"

"Really, already, hundreds of applications have been received, many from girls employed during the day, and living in boarding house bedrooms, are eager to have a garden of their own. Think what an interest it will be, and what a healthy way of spending the early part of a summer evening. A great number of gardens are being assigned to returned soldiers and their families; many soldiers' wives are also eager to have a share in this work. Oh, there will be no lack of workers, particularly

GERMAN CONTROL OF
SCHOOL CONVENTION
IN SASKATCHEWAN

Report Says English Language Discontinued in Twelve Districts in Favor of German and Austrian—Austrian National Anthem Opens School

"Never probably in the history of Canada as a British dominion, has anything so audacious been perpetrated as those things that were accomplished at the provincial convention of the school trustees at Regina last week," says the Melville, Saskatchewan, Canadian.

"A resolution was presented to the convention which was adopted, and was requested to supply a uniform system of school readers in the English language in place of the French, German, and bilingual readers at present authorized by the department. However, P. M. Friesen, Rush Lake, introduced an amendment to table the motion, and the amendment was carried by a vote of 89 to 82, and this naturally shelved the language question for another year. Subsequently, the mover of the amendment became the hero of the gathering, and was elected as the president for the ensuing year, thus disclosing that the majority of the trustees had very little use for British institutions and ideals.

gates from each district is usually invited by the secretary, whether it be the Grain Growers or municipal convention, but at the school trustees' convention, there is, according to information, no such precedent established, but they are allowed to come promiscuously from all parts of the province. Some of the German districts had as many as four delegates present. Therefore, the time is ripe for each school district to be requested by the provincial authorities to send a fixed number of delegates from each district to this trustees' convention.

"We regard the packing of the executive with men of alien nationality as a direct challenge to the English speaking people of this province, and if we have any regard for British traditions we will unhesitatingly accept the challenge and organize for the overthrow of

this pernicious custom, regardless of politics, which has been tolerated in our midst by men who ought to be ashamed of themselves. If we allow things of this nature to go unchecked we will have a greater menace proportionally in the province of Saskatchewan than Germany has ever been to the European powers."

DEFEATED BY PREJUDICE
"The bill in the North Carolina Legislature for municipal suffrage by local option asked so little that there ought to have been no opposition," writes Chief Justice Walter Clark. "But unfortunately we have a large mass of uneducated voters, and their prejudices against change were successfully appealed to. Mr. Roberts has now introduced a bill for local suffrage in Asheville, N. C., which he thinks will pass, and if so, similar acts will be passed for several other towns in the state. If the thin edge of the wedge is just inserted, all else will follow."

WOMEN AS JURORS.
Colorado women are demanding a change in the state constitution in order that they may sit as jurors in trials where women or children are involved. Judge Ben B. Lindsey has long advocated making women eligible for jury service.
