



THE final results of this election will not be known until February, because of the time it will take to obtain the soldiers' vote.

Suppose for a minute that enough people support Sir Wilfrid Laurier in his policy to defeat the cause of Union.

It would take a month to get the old administration out and the new one in. That will bring us to March---and our New Brunswick boys still fighting it out alone, still waiting for the promised help.

It would take until June to get the necessary legislation to take a referendum to decide whether we shall send help to our men or desert them. And still the men of our New Brunswick battalions will be fighting and waiting.

And it would take until October to know the result of the referendum. "Delay! delay! delay!" cried out Lloyd George, and awakened Britain.
